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## What is an alliteration poem?

Alliteration is the repetition of the first consonant sound in a sequence of words that are close to each other. Alliteration typically uses **consonant sounds** at the beginning of a word to give stress to its syllable. This technique plays a crucial role in poetry by lending a strong rhythm and musical structure to any verse.

**Tongue twisters** are a fun way to practice alliteration. They are sentences and phrases that are challenging and difficult to say, because they make you feel like your tongue is all twisted up. Many people use tongue twisters for fun and entertainment as watching people struggle to get the words right as they say the sentences as fast as they can.

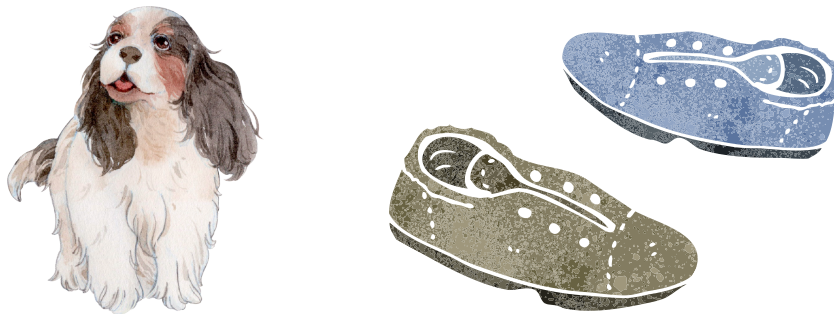
